Committees Recap

Monday (2/10/20)

Senate Innovation, Industry & Technology

SB 658 Acquisition of Water and Wastewater Systems – Senator Albritton

Authorizing certain water and wastewater utilities to establish a rate base value by using the fair market value when acquiring a utility system; establishing a procedure to determine the fair market value; specifying the contents required for an application to the Public Service Commission for approval of the rate base value of the utility system, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020 Temporarily Postponed by Innovation, Industry, and Technology

SB 1352 Transportation Companies – Senator Brandes

Defining the term "transportation network company digital advertising device"; deleting for-hire vehicles from the list of vehicles that are not considered transportation network company (TNC) carriers or are not exempt from certain registration; authorizing TNC drivers or their designees to contract with a company for the installment of TNC digital advertising devices; requiring companies operating such devices to allocate a specified percentage of advertisement inventory to certain organizations, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Favorable with CS by Innovation, Industry, and Technology; 9 Yeas, 1 Nay S

Senate Community Affairs

SB 0538 Emergency Reporting – Senator Diaz

Requiring a county or municipality to report certain incidents to the State Watch Office within the Division of Emergency Management; requiring the division to annually provide the State Watch Office Reportable Incidents List to local emergency managers and the Legislature; requiring the division to notify local emergency managers and the Legislature of any amendments to the reportable incidents list, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable with CS by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 0724 Local Government Recycling Programs – Senator Albritton

Creating the Florida Recycling Working Group; requiring the working group to submit a report to the Legislature by a specified date; providing an expiration date for the working group; providing an exemption for fiscally constrained counties from recycling requirements, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Temporarily Postponed by Community Affairs

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SB 0752 Emergency Sheltering of Persons with Pets – Senator Bean

Requiring the Department of Education to assist the Division of Emergency Management in determining strategies regarding the evacuation of persons with pets; requiring counties that meet specified criteria to designate and operate at least one shelter that can accommodate persons with pets; specifying requirements for such shelters, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020 Favorable with CS by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1066 Impact Fees – Senator Gruters

Revising the conditions that counties, municipalities, and special districts must satisfy before enacting an impact fee by ordinance or passing an impact fee by resolution; providing timeframes for the collection of impact fees by local governments; requiring certain counties and municipalities to establish impact fee review committees, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

SB 1102 Specialty Contracting Services – Senator Gruters

Authorizing certain persons under the supervision of specified licensed contractors to perform certain specialty contracting services for commercial or residential swimming pools, hot tubs or spas, or interactive water features; providing that such supervision does not require a direct contract between those persons, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1148 Electric Bicycles – Senator Brandes

Revising definitions relating to the Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law; authorizing a county or municipality to enact an ordinance regulating the operation of electric bicycles on sidewalks or sidewalk areas when such use is permissible under federal law; expanding exceptions to a prohibition on persons driving certain vehicles on sidewalks and bicycle paths; requiring electric bicycles to comply with specified provisions of law, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1502 Information About Counties and Municipalities – Senator Diaz

Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require the Chief Financial Officer, as prescribed by general law, to annually provide information about counties and municipalities to residents in a manner that allows residents to compare economic and noneconomic factors of each local government, etc.

Favorable by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1512 Local Government Reporting – Senator Diaz

Deleting an annual requirement for county budget officers and municipal budget officers, respectively, to report specified budget information to the Office of Economic and Demographic Research; requiring each county and municipality to annually report specified fiscal and economic information to the Department of Financial Services; requiring the department to annually generate and distribute to residents a specified local government report, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Favorable by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays



SB 1766 Growth Management – Senator Lee

Revising notice of claim requirements for property owners; creating a presumption that certain settlement offers protect the public interest; authorizing property owners to bring actions to declare prohibited exactions invalid; providing applicability; requiring the Department of Transportation to afford a right of first refusal to the previous property owner before disposing of property in certain circumstances, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable by Community Affairs; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

Senate Environment & Natural Resources

SB 1378 Vessels – Senator Rouson

Specifying operation of a vessel at slow speed, minimum wake; prohibiting the operation of vessels at speeds faster than slow speed, minimum wake in certain situations; prohibiting the anchoring or mooring of a vessel to, or within a specified distance of, a mangrove or to vegetation upon, or within a specified distance of, public lands; revising civil penalties relating to certain at-risk vessels and prohibited anchoring or mooring, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable with CS by Environment and Natural Resources; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1572 Climate Change – Senator Stewart

Expressing the Legislature's support for the adoption of policies that will prepare Florida for the environmental and economic impact of climate change, sea-level rise, and flooding, and recognizing the important role that resiliency and infrastructure will play in fortifying this state, etc.

Favorable by Environment and Natural Resources; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 0996 Displacement of Private Waste Companies – Senator Albritton

Requiring a local government to pay a specified amount of compensation to a displaced private waste company at the end of a specified notice period; removing a provision authorizing a local government to pay a specified amount of compensation to a private waste company as an alternative to delaying displacement for a specified period; removing a provision authorizing a local government and a private waste company to negotiate such compensation and notice period, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable with CS by Environment and Natural Resources; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1706 Water Testing for Pollution –Senator Montford

Authorizing specified persons or businesses that suspect contamination of their private water systems, multifamily water systems, or certain public water systems to request that the Department of Health or its agents test such source for pollution, under certain circumstances; requiring such testing to be done within a specified timeframe and follow certain procedures; revising the specified purposes that funds in a County Health Department Trust Fund may be used for to include the costs and expenditures related to certain water testing provisions, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020 Favorable by Environment and Natural Resources; 5 Yeas, 0 Nays



Senate Infrastructure & Security

SB 502 Emergency Mitigation and Response – Senator Montford

Emergency Mitigation and Response; Establishing the Hurricane Michael Recovery Task Force adjunct to the Division of Emergency Management to make recommendations to the Legislature regarding additional assistance needed in the response to recovery from and mitigation of the effects of Hurricane Michael in certain areas; requiring the task force to review the local, state, and federal activities conducted and the resources provided in such areas, the effectiveness of such efforts, and any additional assistance necessary; subject to the appropriation of funds, creating the Hurricane Housing Recovery Program to provide funds to local governments for certain affordable housing recovery efforts, etc. APPROPRIATION: \$1,085,000 Effective Date: Upon becoming a law Favorable with CS by Infrastructure and Security; 8 Yeas, 0 Nays

CS/SB 1332 Towing and Immobilizing Vehicles and Vessels – Senator Hooper, Community Affairs Authorizing local governments to enact rates to tow or immobilize vessels on private property and to remove and store vessels under specified circumstances; prohibiting counties from enacting certain ordinances or rules that impose fees or charges on authorized wrecker operators or towing businesses; authorizing certain persons to place liens on vehicles or vessels to recover specified fees or charges; deleting requirements regarding notices and signs concerning the towing or removal of vehicles or vessels, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable with CS by Infrastructure and Security; 8 Yeas, 0 Nays

Tuesday (2/11/20)

Senate Commerce & Tourism

SB 1128 Vacation Rentals - Senator Diaz

Preempting the regulation of vacation rentals to the state; prohibiting a local law, ordinance, or regulation from allowing or requiring inspections or licensing of vacation rentals; requiring licenses issued by the Division of Hotels and Restaurants of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to be displayed conspicuously to the public inside the licensed establishment, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act, this act shall take effect upon becoming a law

Favorable with CS by Commerce and Tourism; 3 Yeas, 2 Nays

Senate Judiciary

CS/SB 410 Growth Management – Senator Perry, Community Affairs

Requiring the Department of Economic Opportunity to give a preference to certain counties and municipalities when selecting applications for funding for technical assistance; requiring a comprehensive plan to include a property rights element; providing a statement of rights that a local government may use, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable by Judiciary; 5 Yeas, 1 Nay



SB 1340 Legal Notices – Senator Gruters

Providing for the publication of legal notices on certain publicly accessible websites; allowing a governmental agency to publish legal notices on a publicly accessible website under certain circumstances; removing provisions relating to the publication of legal notices in newspapers; providing that an advertisement of a sale or disposition of property may be published on certain websites for a specified time period, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2021

Temporarily Postponed with Amendment adopted by Judiciary

Senate Banking & Insurance

SB 378 Motor Vehicle Insurance – Senator Lee and others

Repealing provisions which comprise the Florida Motor Vehicle No-Fault Law; revising the motor vehicle insurance coverages that an applicant must show to register certain vehicles with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; revising garage liability insurance requirements for motor vehicle dealer applicants; revising minimum liability coverage requirements for motor vehicle owners or operators, etc. CLAIM: \$83,651 Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect January 1, 2021

Senate Children, Families, and Elder Affairs

SB 1678 Substance Abuse and Mental Health – Senator Montford

Revising the definition of "mental illness"; requiring that respondents with a serious mental illness be informed of the essential elements of recovery and be provided assistance with accessing a continuum of care regimen; prohibiting the court from considering substantive information in the transfer evaluation unless the evaluator testifies at the hearing; revising the requirements for when a person may be taken to a receiving facility for involuntary examination; requiring that the state attorney represent the state as the real party of interest in an involuntary proceeding, subject to legislative appropriation, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable with CS by Children, Families, and Elder Affairs; 6 Yeas, 0 Nays

House Ways & Means

HJR 369 Limitation on Homestead Assessments – Representative Roth

Proposes amendments to State Constitution to increase period of time during which accrued benefit from specified limitations on homestead property tax assessments may be transferred from prior homestead to new homestead. Effective Date: Not Specified Favorable by Ways & Means Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 371 Limitations on Homestead Assessments – Representative Roth

Revises timeframe during which accrued benefit from specified limitations on homestead property tax assessments may be transferred from prior homestead to new homestead; revises timeframe during which an owner of homestead property significantly damaged or destroyed by named tropical storm or hurricane must establish new homestead to make certain election. Effective Date: on the



effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 369 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose Favorable by Ways & Means Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays

HJR 977 Ad Valorem Tax Discount for Spouses of Certain Deceased Veterans Who Had Permanent, Combat-Related Disabilities – Representative Killebrew and others Revises definition "rental company" to exclude certain motor vehicle dealers, for purpose of determining minimum insurance coverage requirements; provides specified motor vehicle dealers & their affiliates are immune to causes of action & not vicariously or directly liable for harm to persons or property; provides specified motor vehicle dealers & their affiliates are not adjudged liable in civil proceedings or guilty in criminal proceedings. Effective Date: July 1, 2020 Favorable by Judiciary Committee; 16 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 879 Surviving Spouse Ad Valorem Tax Exemption — Representative Killebrew and others Authorizes surviving spouses of certain permanently disabled veterans to carry over certain discount on ad valorem taxes on homestead property under specified conditions; authorizes discount to be transferred to another permanent residence under specified conditions; provides procedure by which applicant may file application after specified date & request discount; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules. Effective Date: on the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 877, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose

Favorable by Ways & Means Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays

CS/HB 1001 Brownfields – Representative Stone, Agriculture & Natural Resources
Revises conditions under which an applicant that has rehabilitated contaminated site may receive certain tax credits; revises types of projects eligible for specified tax credit; revises date by which DEP must issue annual site rehabilitation tax credit certificate awards; specifies exceptions to grant of authority that persons may file legal actions resulting from certain discharges or pollution; conforms provisions to changes made by act; revises entities that may propose brownfield designations; removes requirement that certain persons be identified before negotiating brownfield site rehabilitation agreement; exempts certain job creation requirements for eligibility for specified brownfield site rehabilitation agreements. Effective Date: July 1, 2020
Favorable with CS by Ways & Means Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays

House Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations

CS/HB 715 Reclaimed Water — Representative Maggard, Agriculture & Natural Resources
Prohibits domestic wastewater treatment facilities from disposing of effluent, reclaimed water, or
reuse water by surface water discharge; provides reclaimed water is water source for public water
supply systems; provides groundwater & surface water quality protections, expedited permitting, &
tax credits for potable reuse projects; requires counties, municipalities, & special districts to authorize
& provide incentives for graywater technologies; requires DEP to convene technical advisory
committee. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Favorable by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee; 7 Yeas, 0 Nays



HB 1061 Aquatic Preserves – Representative Massullo

Creates Nature Coast Aquatic Preserve; designates preserve for inclusion in aquatic preserve system & as Outstanding Florida Water; describes boundaries of preserve. Effective Date: July 1, 2020 Favorable with CS by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee; 8 Yeas, 0 Nays

CS/HB 1091 Environmental Enforcement – Representative Fine, Agriculture & Natural Resources Increases civil penalties for violations of certain provisions relating to beach & shore construction, Biscayne Bay Aquatic Preserve, aquatic preserves, state water resource plan, artesian wells, pollution, operating terminal facility without discharge prevention & response certificates, discharge contingency plans for vessels, Pollutant Discharge Prevention & Control Act, Clean Ocean Act, pollution of surface & ground waters, regulation of oil & gas resources, Phosphate Land Reclamation Act, sewage disposal facilities, pollution control, reasonable costs & expenses for pollution releases, necessary permits, dumping litter, small quantity generators, abatement of imminent hazards caused by hazardous substances, hazardous waste generators, transporters, or facilities, & coral reef protection; provides that certain conditions constitute separate offenses. Effective Date: July 1, 2020 Favorable by Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee; 9 Yeas, 0 Nays

House Appropriations

CS/HB 1111 Government Integrity — Representative Tomkow, Public Integrity & Ethics Creates Florida Integrity Office under Auditor General; revises provisions related to legislative procedure definitions, Auditor General, Chief Inspector General, CFO investigations, government efficiency hotline, agency inspectors general, saving sharing program, & contracting. Effective Date: July 1, 2020

Favorable by Appropriations Committee; 26 Yeas, 0 Nays

CS/HB 1181 Florida Disaster Volunteer Leave Act – Representative Maggard, Oversight, Transparency & Public Management

Provides certain employees may be granted leave of absence with pay for specified period of time; provides requirements for such leave to be granted; provides restrictions on location employee may provide disaster-related services; requires certain documentation from employee. Effective Date: July 1, 2020

Favorable by Appropriations Committee; 27 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 1343 Water Quality Improvements – Representative Payne, Ingoglia & others

Requires DOH & DEP to submit reports & recommendations relating to transfer of Onsite Sewage Program in DOH to DEP; transfers Onsite Sewage Program from DOH to DEP; requires WMDs to submit consolidated annual reports to OEDR; removes provisions relating to DOH technical review & advisory panel & research & review advisory committee; directs DEP to determine that hardship exists for certain OSTDS onsite variance requests; creates OSTDS technical advisory committee; requires county health departments to coordinate with DEP to administer evaluation programs; requires basin management action plans to include treatment & remediation plans; requires DEP to submit cost estimates to OEDR; provides for management of biosolids & water quality monitoring; establishes clean water grant program. Effective Date: July 1, 2021

Favorable by Appropriations Committee; 28 Yeas, 0 Nays



House Government Operations & Technology Appropriations

HB 1161 Local Licensing – Plakon

Provides individuals who hold valid, active local licenses may work within scope of such licenses in any local government jurisdiction without needing to meet additional licensing requirements; provides that local governments have disciplinary jurisdiction over such licensees; requires local governments to forward any disciplinary orders to licensee's original licensing jurisdiction for further action; requires DBPR to create & maintain local licensing information system. Effective Date: October 1, 2020

Favorable by Government Operations & Technology Appropriations; 10 Yeas, 2 Nays

House Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee

HB 687 Services for Veterans and Their Families – Representative Zika

Services for Veterans and Their Families: Authorizes DVA to establish Florida Veterans' Care Coordination Program to provide behavioral health care referral & care coordination services for veterans & their families; authorizes DVA to contract with certain nonprofit entity to enter into agreements with Florida 211 Network participants to provide such services; provides for statewide delivery of specified services by program teams; requires Florida 211 Network participants to collect program implementation data & submit such data to DVA; requires DVA to submit report to Governor & Legislature. Effective Date: July 1, 2020

Favorable with CS by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee; 10 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 1071 - Substance Abuse and Mental Health – Representative M. Grant

Substance Abuse and Mental Health: Revises provisions related to substance abuse and mental health, including requirements for Criminal Justice, Mental Health, & Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant Program; community action treatment teams; requirements for school substance abuse prevention partnership grants; continuing education requirements of certain experts; & department requirements. Effective Date: July 1, 2020

Favorable by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee; 10 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 1081 - Substance Abuse and Mental Health – Representative Stevenson

Substance Abuse and Mental Health: Expands definition of "mental illness" to provide certain exclusions; revises entities that are exempt from certain licensing requirements; authorizes jails to share medical information pertaining to specified defendants to DCF; requires maintenance of psychotropic medications to specified defendants; provides exception. Effective Date: July 1, 2020 Favorable by Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee; 9 Yeas, 0 Nays

Wednesday (2/12/20)

Senate Rules

SB 630 Regulation of Smoking – Senator Mayfield

Authorizing municipalities and counties to further restrict smoking within the boundaries of certain public parks, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020



Favorable by Rules; 15 Yeas, 0 Nays

SJR 396 Single-subject Limitation for Taxation and Budget Reform Commission —Senator Rodriguez Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to require that any proposals to revise the State Constitution, or any part thereof, filed by the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission be limited to a single subject, etc.

Favorable by Rules; 16 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 1398 Regional Planning Council Meetings – Senator Flores

Providing requirements for establishing a quorum for meetings of certain councils when a voting member appears via telephone, real-time videoconferencing, or similar real-time electronic or video communication; requiring the member to give notice of intent to appear via telephone, real-time videoconferencing, or similar real-time electronic or video communication by a specified time; requiring the Department of Economic Opportunity to give a preference to certain counties and municipalities when selecting applications for funding for technical assistance, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable with CS by Rules; 16 Yeas, 0 Nays; Placed on Calendar, on 2nd reading

House Judiciary

HB 1199 Environmental Protection Act – Representative Ingoglia

Prohibits local governments from recognizing or granting certain legal rights to natural environment or granting such rights relating to natural environment to person or political subdivision. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Favorable by Judiciary Committee; 13 Yeas, 2 Nays

House Health & Human Services

HB 163 Homelessness – Representative Altman

Provides requirements for continuum of care catchment areas & lead agencies; requires continuums of care to create continuum of care plans; revises requirements for certain grants; establishes grantin-aid program to help continuums of care prevent & end homelessness; provides program requirements. Effective Date: July 1, 2020

Favorable by Health & Human Services Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 573 Peer Support for First Responders – Representative Casello

Peer Support for First Responders: Prohibits certain persons who participate in peer support communication with first responders from testifying or divulging specified information under certain circumstances; provides exceptions; prohibits liability & cause of action. Effective Date: July 1, 2020 Favorable by Health & Human Services Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays



HB 705 Emergency Sheltering of Persons with Pets – Representative Killebrew and Representative Toledo

Emergency Sheltering of Persons with Pets: Requires DOE to assist DEM in determining strategies regarding evacuation of persons with pets; requires certain counties to designate shelter that can accommodate persons with pets; specifies requirements for such shelters. Effective Date: July 1, 2020 Favorable by Health & Human Services Committee; 17 Yeas, 0 Nays

HB 1083 Student Mental Health Procedures – Representative Webb

Student Mental Health Procedures: Requires verification that certain strategies have been utilized & certain outreach has been initiated before student is removed from school, school transportation, or school-sponsored activity under specified circumstances; provides exception. Effective Date: July 1, 2020

Favorable by Health & Human Services Committee; 18 Yeas, 0 Nays

Thursday (2/13/20)

Senate Finance & Tax

SB 126 Sales and Use Tax - Senator Gruters

Revising the definition of the term "retail sale"; renaming the term "mail order sale" to "remote sale" and revising the definition; revising conditions under which certain dealers are subject to sales tax levies and collection; providing that certain marketplace providers are subject to registration, collection, and remittance requirements for sales taxes, etc. Effective Date: Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon this act becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2020

Favorable by Finance and Tax; 8 Yeas, 0 Nays

SJR 146 homestead Property Tax Assessments/Increased Portability Fund – Senator Brandes, Community Affairs

Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to increase the period of time during which the accrued benefit from specified limitations on homestead property tax assessments may be transferred from a prior homestead to a new homestead, and to provide an effective date, etc. Favorable by Finance and Tax; 7 Yeas, 1 Nay

CS/SB 148 Limitations on Homestead Exemption Assessments – Senator Brandes, Community Affairs Revising the timeframe during which the accrued benefit from specified limitations on homestead property tax assessments may be transferred from a prior homestead to a new homestead; revising the timeframe during which an owner of homestead property significantly damaged or destroyed by a named tropical storm or hurricane must establish a new homestead to make a certain election, etc. Effective Date: On the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by SJR 146 or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose, if such amendment to the State Constitution is approved at the general election held in November 2020 or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose Favorable by Finance and Tax; 7 Yeas, 1 Nay



CS/SB 514 Homestead Exemptions – Senator Gruters, Community Affairs

Providing that a person or family unit receiving or claiming the benefit of certain ad valorem tax exemptions or tax credits in another state is entitled to the homestead exemption in this state if the person or family unit demonstrates certain conditions to the property appraiser; providing that homestead exemption forms prescribed by the Department of Revenue may include taxpayer information relating to such ad valorem tax exemptions or tax credits in another state, etc. Effective Date: 7/1/2020

Favorable by Finance and Tax; 8 Yeas, 0 Nays

SB 524 Sales Tax Holiday for Disaster Preparedness Supplies – Senator Gruters

Providing exemptions from the sales and use tax for specified disaster preparedness supplies during a specified timeframe; providing applicability for certain exemptions; specifying locations where the exemptions do not apply, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law Favorable with CS by Finance and Tax; 8 Yeas, 0 Nays

CS/SB 542 Back-to-school Sales Tax Holiday - Senator Perry, Commerce & Tourism
