Septic to Sewer Conversion

HB 2917 by Representative Toby Overdorf – **Martin County Port Salerno/New Monrovia Vacuum Sewer System** was voted favorable by the Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee; 11 Yeas, 0 Nays. This is a \$4 million dollar match request for the next county septic to sewer priority in the county's "Connect to Protect" program.

Executive Branch

Governor Ron DeSantis sent a letter to Florida Senate President Wilton Simpson and Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives Chris Sprowls outlining how to utilize a portion of federal funds the state is expected to receive via the recently signed *American Rescue Plan Act of 2021*.

The federal stimulus package provides \$1.9 trillion in new spending in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Act includes "Coronavirus State and Local Recovery Funds," which provides \$195.3 billion to the States and the District of Columbia. The Governor's recommendations include providing assistance to Floridians in need, and making major investments in critical areas such as infrastructure, education, and workforce development to continue Florida's rapid economic recovery.

South Florida Coral Reef Ecosystem Conservation Area

Members of the Florida House of Representatives honored former Coconut Creek House Democrat Kristin Jacobs, who lost her battle to cancer in 2020 after six years of service in the Florida House. Members voted to pass **HB 217** unanimously. The legislation, sponsored by Representative Christine Hunschofksy honors Representative Jacobs by directing the Florida Department of Environmental Protection to erect suitable markers designating the South Florida Coral Reef Ecosystem Conservation Area as the "Kristin Jacobs Coral Reef Ecosystem."

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HB 0001 Combating Public Disorder by Fernandez-Barquin

Combating Public Disorder: Authorizes elected officials to file appeal to Administration Commission if municipality makes reduction to budget of municipal law enforcement agency; provides for cause of action against municipality for failing to provide law enforcement protection during riot; revises penalties for certain riot related offenses; prohibits cyberintimidation by publication; prohibits specified assemblies from engaging in disorderly & violent conduct; creates affirmative defense to civil action where plaintiff participated in riot or unlawful assembly.
