Entry to Airport Operations Area (AOA) or Other Restricted Areas - No person shall enter the AOA, Security Identification Display Area (SIDA) or other restricted area of the Airport except persons who enter in accordance with security clearance pursuant to the security program established or authorized by the Airport Manager.

Security Devices and Directives - No person shall in any way tamper or interfere with a lock or closing mechanism of any door or gate leading to the AOA, SIDA or other restricted area, nor shall any person otherwise knowingly breach, disobey or disregard any security program, directive or plan at the Airport.

Security Violations - In addition to other remedies, violation of the security program, if any, shall subject such person or tenant to damages equal to the greater of the following:

- 1. \$1,000 per occurrence not as a penalty, but as liquidated damages for fines or administrative costs incurred by the County as a result of the violation; or
- 2. An amount equal to any civil fine imposed by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) upon the County as a result of the violation.

Intentional Security Violation - Any person who knowingly or intentionally enters or allows another person to enter any restricted area without proper authorization by use of any key, gate card, identification badge, vehicle permit, or other such instrument shall immediately and permanently be denied access to the Airport and shall be required to immediately relinquish such instrument to the County.

Vehicles - In addition to the requirements contained in Rules & Regulations, Section 7 & 8, the operator of each vehicle requiring access to the areas where aircraft are parked, the AOA or the SIDA, shall be required to obtain an entry access card from the office of the Airport Manager. Unless the vehicle is at all times operated under the escort of a tenant employee or is otherwise subject to Section 5.4 of the Rules, each vehicle owner shall be required to provide the following (at time of being badged).

- 1. A current copy of the vehicle insurance policy. Vehicles requiring access to the AOA shall maintain liability limits as required by the Martin County Minimum Standards for Aeronautical Activities.
- 2. An application from their sponsoring tenant or club documenting the need for vehicle access.
- 3. Sign a statement acknowledging an understanding of these Rules and Regulations and the operators agreement to comply with these Rules and Regulations.
