#### **Local Actions**


- No open burning is permitted due to the dry conditions.

- Martin County playgrounds, tennis, pickleball and basketball courts, park restroom facilities and athletic fields for organized and pickup are closed.
- Martin County-owned boat ramps will be open for recreational boating activities on weekdays and be closed on weekends only; Sandspirt Park and the Jensen Beach Boat Ramp north of Indian RiverSide Park will be open to commercial marine activity


### **CDC** Recommendations
