Driver Education Grants Available for Martin County Schools

STUART, Fla (May 28, 2025) – The Martin County Board of County Commissioners is accepting grant applications from **public and private schools** in Martin County to enhance driver education programs. The application is available on the county's website at <https://www.martin.fl.us/DoriGrantApplication>.

Created in 2002, the Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act allows the Martin County Clerk of Court and Comptroller to collect an additional \$5 with each civil traffic penalty. These funds are then distributed to schools through a competitive grant process to enhance existing driver education programs.

Grant Application Details

- Grant applications are evaluated on the basis of the success of the proposed program and shall be used for enhancement of driver education programs, not administration.
- Each driver education program shall require a minimum of 30% of a student's time for behind-the-wheel training.
- Submissions must include the required application, a one-page description of how the driver education program meets the requirements and the amount of grant money being requested.
- The **deadline** to apply is **Friday, June 20, 2025 before 5 p.m.**
- Grant applications should be placed in an envelope marked Dori Slosberg Grant and mailed or dropped off at Martin County Board of County Commissioners Administration Building, 2401 SE Monterey Road, Stuart, FL 34996.
