RECENT UPDATES

New Boat ramps:

All restrictions for Martin County-owned boat ramps have been lifted as of May 1, 2020. State restrictions remain in place as follows:

- All state-owned uplands, such as beaches, islands, sandbars and emergent shoals within aquatic
 preserves, including the sandbars located in the Intracoastal Waterway, remain closed by order
 of the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.
- The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission has directed that recreational vessels shall have no more than 10 people on board and maintain a 50-foot distance between each vessel.

New Beaches:

All Martin County public beach access points, with the exception of Hobe Sound Beach, will be open as of Monday, May 4. Beachgoers must follow CDC guidelines and park in designated spaces. Bathtub Beach remains closed due to existing erosion issues.

New County parks:

At the May 1 Martin County Board of County Commissioners meeting, the board relaxed restrictions for recreational activities at county-owned facilities. Pavilions and public restrooms will open, while playgrounds and playground equipment remain closed due to health safety concerns.

There are no further restrictions on racquet sports such as tennis, racquetball and pickleball. The board requests that players participating in racquet sports adhere to social distancing guidelines on and off the courts. In addition, it is important for players to clean and disinfect high touch surfaces.

Use of trails, pathways, boardwalks, fishing piers and open areas is permitted. Lap swimming will be reopened at Sailfish Splash Waterpark. Phipps Park Campground will remain open and is not accepting any new reservations.

Social distancing and group size restrictions at all Martin County parks and facilities, as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, are required.

New Golf courses:

Effective Friday, May 1, Martin County golf courses are allowed to be open to both residents and non-residents. New guidelines allow 2 golfers per cart as long as they belong to the same household. Courses will need to have a system to identify two-person carts that have been checked and can be visibly recognized from a distance. In addition, courses must continue to follow PGA, USGA, CDC and NGCOA COVID-19 guidelines.

New Governor DeSantis reopening plan:

On Wednesday, April 29, Governor Ron DeSantis released his "Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Plan for Florida's Recovery" which outlines a phased approach to reopening.

Highlights of Phase 1 include:

- Schools continue with distance learning
- · Visits to senior living facilities are prohibited
- Elective surgeries statewide can resume
- Restaurants may offer outdoor seating with six-foot space between tables and indoor seating at 25% capacity
- Retail can operate at 25% of indoor capacity
- No change for bars or gyms
- Vulnerable individuals should avoid close contact with people outside of their home

New Vehicle registration:

The Martin County Tax Collector's office has announced that Express Lane same day/next day tag service is currently available. Order and pay online and then pick up at the Palm City office drive-thru window.

New School District:

All Florida school districts will remain closed for the remainder of the 2019-2020 academic year. All Martin County School District and school-related events, programs, athletic events and activities have been canceled for the same time period, with the exception of high school graduation ceremonies. The district continues to collaborate with health and safety experts to plan traditional graduation ceremonies, tentatively in late July. More information will be released as it becomes available. Special BOCC meeting:

The next special meeting of the Martin County Board of County Commissioners is scheduled for Friday, May 8 at 9 a.m. in the John F. and Rita M. Armstrong Wing of the Blake Library. Meetings are open to the public and available on MCTV, Comcast Channel 20 and U-verse Channel 99. Meetings are also streamed on our website at www.martin.fl.us and on Martin County's Facebook and YouTube pages.

Public comment at BOCC meetings:

The fillable public comment form for Board of County Commissioners meetings can be found at www.martin.fl.us/BCCPublicComment. Commenters simply provide their name, the item they wish to comment on, enter up to 5,000 characters of text and then click submit. Once received, staff will review the comments to make sure they don't violate county policy. During the meeting, county staff will read the message into the record but will be limited to three minutes per the county's established public comment procedure. Comments for an item must be submitted prior to the end of the public comment period for that item to be read into the record. Staff will then provide the comments, in their entirety, to the Clerk to attach to the minutes as an official record.

Building closures:

All county buildings and constitutional offices (Tax Collector, Clerk and Comptroller, Supervisor of Elections and Property Appraiser) are closed to walk-in traffic but still providing service to the public. TESTING

Cleveland Clinic Martin Health:

Cleveland Clinic Martin Health is performing drive-thru testing for COVID-19 by appointment only at Martin North Hospital, 200 SE Hospital Avenue in Stuart, and Tradition Hospital, 10000 SW Innovation Way in Port St. Lucie. Anyone over the age of 16 who has a fever and respiratory illness (such as cough, runny nose, sneezing) or any patient with a fever and gastrointestinal illness (such as diarrhea, vomiting) is eligible for testing. For an appointment, individuals must call 772-419-3360, between 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday – Friday and 8 a.m. – 3 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. Testing hours for both locations are from 9 a.m. – 3 p.m., Monday – Friday and 9 a.m. – 1 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. For additional

COMMUNITY AND BUSINESS RESOURCES CARES Act:

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act, also known as the CARES Act, signed into law on March 27, provides direct financial relief for families and assistance for small businesses.

CARES Act economic impact payment:

\$1,200 recovery checks will be sent to individuals earning up to \$75,000 or married couples earning under \$150,000. Benefits are reduced for income starting at \$75,000 for individuals and \$150,000 for married couples filing jointly. Couples will also receive an additional \$500 for each child. Eligibility is based on 2019 (or 2018 if 2019 not filed) tax returns.

Economic impact payments will be distributed automatically and deposited directly into the same bank account reflected on 2018 or 2019 tax returns. Paper checks will be mailed to those who do not have direct deposit information on file with the IRS. For more information, visit www.irs.gov/coronavirus.

Social Security Administration economic impact payments:

The Social Security Administration announced that Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients will receive automatic economic impact payments no later than early May. More information is available at www.ssa.gov.

Reemployment assistance:

Governor DeSantis has waived the eligibility requirements for claimants currently seeking unemployment benefits. Claimants do not need to register with the state job search portal and do not need to submit the number of employers they contact each week. The suspension of these requirements has a retroactive start date of March 15 through May 2. For more, visit www.FloridaJobs.org/COVID-19. PREVENTION REMINDERS
