We know that hardscape surfaces such as roads, driveways, sidewalks, and parking lots are major contributors to storm water runoff problems as they quickly drain water into storm sewers and into local waterways, but there is another impervious surface that is also a problem – roofs.

When you think of all the surface area that roofs make up and the enormous amounts of water falling on them we can see they drain off huge amounts of water that also usually makes it way to storm sewers and local lakes, streams, and estuaries. A solution to this is collecting or filtering this water within your own landscape.

Rain barrels and cisterns can be used to collect this water where it can be used to irrigate plants during drier periods. Another solution is the rain garden which uses a low area of the yard to hold and filter the water before returning it to the aquifer.
